

Biography – SV Trial Judge Tim Kramny



I was born in Saarbrücken, Germany on January 9, 1970. I received my first German Shepherd Dog at the age of 9. I became a member of the SV in 1980. Even as a teenager I actively participated in local and regional junior handler competitions.

In 1992 I became a teaching helper. During my time as teaching helper for regions 10 and 11, I worked many regional competitions and worked the Bundessiegerprüfung (BSP) in 1997. In 2007 I was appointed as one of the helpers for the working class male TSB Test at the Bundessiegerhauptzuchtschau (BSZS)

In 2009 I began my path to become a trial judge and was appointed in October of 2010. Since my appointment I was asked to judge five FH regional qualifiers, four regional junior championships and often at regional championships for LG 10. I was involved in two national championships and have been appointed as a judge in the obedience for the BSP 2025. In 2016 I was elected as the Training supervisor of LG10.

Since joining the SV in 1980 I have trained many dogs. I was able to start at five south German junior championships, 20 regional qualifiers, two national FCI qualifiers and 5 BSPs.

I also work with dogs in my professional life. During my career with the German military, I was responsible for military dogs in 3 states. Since 2005 I am a trainer at the German Military School for military dogs. I train protection, drug and bomb detection dogs for the German military police.
